



Sterling launches NEW British Standard mortice locks



Door locks must be high quality and thief-resistant to give customers confidence. In line with the NEW BS standards, Sterling has made further developments to their range to launch a **NEW** line of **5 Lever Mortice Locks**.

New standards mean locks must survive at least 200,000 latching cycles, have increased resistance to attack and still operate after a 96-hour neutral salt spray test and at temperature extremes of -20°C and +80°C.

To make sure you are stocking the right locks look out for:

- The minimum requirements state that the manufacturer's name, trademark and the number and date of the new standard, BS 3621, must be visible on the product.
- The packaging must have manufacturer's name, clear product identification, 11-box classification code according to the BS or EN standard, number and year of BS standard and the limitations on application, e.g. suitable only for timber doors.

NEW Sterling 5 Lever Mortice Sashlocks and Deadlocks are insurance approved BS3621-2004 and are British Standard Kitemarked. They have anti-drill plates on both sides of the lock case, an anti-pick curtain and an anti-drill 20mm bolt throw. Both options can be used internally and externally.
